


Austin Classical Guitar has led the creation of literacy-based, for-credit guitar courses in American schools since 2001. ACG has partner teachers in forty-five Texas school districts and most US States. In addition to developing guitar programs in typical classrooms across the nation, ACG has also created Texas' first and only for-credit performing arts course for incarcerated students, and the world's first braille-based sequential guitar learning system.

In 2008 ACG launched GuitarCurriculum.com, a first-of-its-kind teacher resource for classroom guitar that is now used around the world. ACG staff provide extensive teacher training, district consultation, and developed Texas' large-ensemble concert and sight reading contest following established standards.




Guitar Students

Non-Guitar Students




2023 STAAR Test Results in Austin ISD*




23-24 BEHAVIORAL REFERRALS IN AUSTIN ISD*

* District data from 21 campuses, about 1,700 guitar students, compared with non-guitarist peers matched by campus and demographic.




INCREASING FINE ARTS ENROLLMENT

CURRICULUM: Used in 45 Texas school districts and 40 US states, Austin Classical Guitar's GuitarCurriculum has been a leading classroom guitar resource with comprehensive instructional materials and teaching support for guitar directors since 2008.

TRAINING: Our team has supported the development of hundreds of school-based guitar programs across the nation. Each year ACG Education provides national training summits in multiple locations, school in-service training, direct consultation, and remote support.

ASSESSMENT: In 2014 ACG developed the Large Guitar Ensemble Concert & Sight-Reading Contest for Austin ISD based on UIL rules and procedures. We have since assisted with development of similar contests in Houston, Corpus Christie, Brownsville, and El Paso.







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
